VEILING OF STATUES AND ICONS DURING PASSIONTIDE

Beginning the 5th Sunday of Lent

Traditionally, the two weeks of "Passiontide" begin the fifth Sunday of Lent. The first week is Passion Week, and the second week is Holy Week.

In the Roman Missal we find the instruction, "In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images [and statues] remain covered until the beginning of Easter Vigil."

The veiling of crosses and images is a sort of "fasting" from sacred depictions which represent the paschal glory of our salvation. Just as the Lenten fast concludes with the Paschal feast, so too, our fasting from the cross culminates in an adoration of the holy wood on which the sacrifice of Calvary was offered for our sins. Likewise, a fasting from the glorious images of the mysteries of faith and the saints in glory, culminates on Easter night with a renewed appreciation of the glorious victory won by Christ, risen from the tomb to win for us eternal life.

Bring In Last Year's Blessed Palms


A container is located in the vestibule to collect your palms from previous years. They will be burned in the Easter Vigil holy fire.

other sacraments. The primary church is generally where the parish office is located, the parish records are kept, and often where the priest(s) will reside.

Secondary Church (S) - St. Patrick, Wapella --- a church under the care of the parish where some pastoral care will be provided. This would include Sunday Mass and other sacraments in so far as possible, as determined by the pastor.

Not in Use (N) - Sacred Heart, Farmer City in this model. St John the Evangelist, Bellflower merged into Sacred Heart, Farmer City January 15, 2017.
